

The sulky is a small lightweight carriage, of English origin that was adapted to the customs of Argentina.

It is pulled by a single horse and where they can travel two or three people, and it was very used in rural areas.

It was used between the years 1800 until the beginning of the 20th century.

This model is a replica of a sulky "porteño" typical of the city of Buenos Aires with its characteristic ornamental filleted.

It is built on an artisan scale with pine wood, its rods are milled and molded, it has been used bronze, twisted square bronze, natural and blued, both the steel elastics and the wheels brass tires in bronze are working, mini screws were used and silver welding in metals and in structural joints.

Upholstered in national leather of goat (cabritilla).

For its painting the classic filleted of Buenos Aires one has been represented.

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
